NEW REQUESTS

Infinite Design Studio, LLC Savay Deals, LLC VivaVets, Inc. The closed session of the September 11, 2025, meeting was summarized. The Authority Board meeting was attended by Les Hall, Chuck Martin, Mara Sierocinski, Ben Siegel, Gina Ramsey, and Sharon Pinder. The meeting was closed to comply with requirements of the Maryland Public Information Act so that there would not be disclosure of confidential, commercial, and financial information associated with the applicants. The meeting was closed to discuss the new requests of Hungry Harvest, LLC (EPIP & SSBCI). Both requests were approved.

1. Hungry Harvest, LLC – New Request – Approved both the \$322,000 of SSBCI investment that was rescinded in 2024, and \$200,000 in the form of convertible notes, with a term of 3 years and an 15% simple interest rate.
