The closed session of the November 26, 2024, meeting was summarized. The Authority Board meeting was attended by Les Hall, Chuck Martin, Mara Sierocinski, Sharon Pinder, and Gina Ramsey. The meeting was closed to comply with requirements of the Maryland Public Information Act so that there would not be disclosure of confidential, commercial, and financial information associated with the applicants. The meeting was closed to discuss the new requests of Aidar Health, Inc. and American Continuing Education Solutions, LLC; and the modification requests of JesseJay's Company, LLC and New City Construction, LLC. All the requests were approved.

- 1. New City Construction, LLC Approve modification to accept the risk that MSBDFA's 1st place lien may be treated in different order when the Company goes through a bankruptcy process. In addition, the Authority to accept the risk that many UCC1 financing statements contain language that any further encumbering of collateral may constitute tortious interference.
- 2. JesseJay's, LLC Approve modification to extend loan maturity 5 years and amortize over 15 years and increase outstanding loan balance of \$262,000 to \$382,000.
- 3. Aidar Health, Inc. New Deal. Approved \$800,000 in SSBCI in form of a SAFE.
- 4. American Continuing Education Solutions, LLC dba ACES Physical Therapy and Home Health – Approved \$250,000 of Term Loan, 60 months, 7% fixed, 1st lien on company assets; 3rd IDOT on residence of Courtland Wyatt at 14507 Saint Gregory Way. Accokeek, MD 20607.
