Withdrawn. The Bank involved in the project was just advised it must comply with the new SBA regulations that became effective on June 30, 2025, and is now reviewing the terms of the equity offering considering the new regulatory requirements.

The closed session of the July 31, 2025, meeting was summarized. The Authority Board meeting was attended by Les Hall, Ben Siegel, Mara Sierocinski, Kenny Oreagba, and Gina Ramsey. The meeting was closed to comply with requirements of the Maryland Public Information Act so that there would not be disclosure of confidential, commercial, and financial information associated with the applicants. The meeting was closed to discuss the modification request of One Leg Up Pets, LLC; and the new requests of SoFine Food, LLC dba Dress It Up Dressing - (SSBCI) and Salus Capital, Inc., dba Eagle Physical Therapy and Rehabilitation, Inc. - (SSBCI). All the requests were approved.

- 1. One Leg Up Pets, LLC Modification granted to increase loan by \$384,000 and to subordinate SSBCI loan.
- 2. SoFine Food LLC, dba Dress it Up Dressing New Request Approved \$500,000 SSBCI, SAFE.
- 3. Salus Capital, Inc., dba Eagle Physical Therapy and Rehabilitation, Inc. New Request Approved \$1,000,000, SSBCI, term loan, 7 years, 4%.
