MSBDFA Annual Portfolio Review

The closed session of the November 22, 2022, meeting was summarized. The Authority Board meeting was attended by Les Hall, Mara Sierocinski, Clem Kaikis, Kenny Oreagba and Laura Pasternak. The meeting was closed to comply with requirements of the Maryland Public Information Act so that there would not be disclosure of confidential, commercial, and financial information associated with the applicants. The meeting was closed to discuss the modification request of Domesticity, LLC; and the new requests of Calmi Electrical Company, Inc., and The Ripp'd Canvas Corporation. All the requests were approved.

- 1. Domesticity, LLC/Real Creative, LLC Approve release of indemnity deed of trust on personal residence of guarantors located at 2111 Lake Montebello Terrace, Baltimore, Maryland subject to payment of \$15,000 towards payment of MSBDFA loan
- 2. Calmi Electric Company, Inc. \$1,500,000 surety bond line of credit subject to approval of additional debt by Commerce VLT Program Manager
- 3. The Ripp'd Canvas Corporation \$350,000 EPIP term loan subject to condition that the company and any related companies of the guarantor lease in the aggregate a minimum of 51% of the usable space in the building (including the basement) during the term of the loan
