Calmi Electric Company, Inc. The Ripp'd Canvas Corporation The closed session of the November 10, 2022, meeting was summarized. The Authority Board meeting was attended by Les Hall, Mara Sierocinski, Clem Kaikis, Chuck Martin and Sharon Pinder. The meeting was closed to comply with requirements of the Maryland Public Information Act so that there would not be disclosure of confidential, commercial, and financial information associated with the applicants. The meeting was closed to discuss the new requests of Aidar Health, Inc. and Move Logic, LLC. Both requests were approved.

- 1. Aidar Health, Inc. \$200,000 EPIP investment (possible SSBCI) subject to (1) provision by MMG of proof of concept; and (2) MMG show 51% ownership of eligible applicants required in Section 5-557 (d) and (e) of the MSBDFA statute in the relationship summary and write-up
- 2. Move Logic, LLC \$140,000 EPIP term loan subject to payment in full of Capital One loan or evidence of a payment plan

The Open Meeting then closed at 1:20p.m. upon motion made and seconded, and approved by all voting members, the meeting was closed pursuant to General Provisions Article, Section 3-305(b) (13), "to comply with a specific... statutory... requirement that prevents public disclosures about a particular proceeding or matter", that is, the Maryland Public Information Act prohibits disclosure of trade secrets, confidential commercial and confidential financial information.
