KENT COUNTY, MARYLAND

Kent County, founded in 1642, is located on the Eastern Shore of Maryland directly east of Baltimore and is bounded by the Sassafras and Chester Rivers, the State of Delaware, and the Chesapeake Bay. The county is located within 90 minutes of three international airports and three major seaports. Route 301 provides a major north-south artery for commercial transportation, linking Maryland to Delaware and making the area a perfect location for warehouse and distribution operations. A border-to-border, open-access, high-capacity fiber-optic network encourages the growth of diverse businesses such as data centers, call centers, cyber security, telemedicine, training and education centers. Highways: U.S. 301 and MD 213

Rail: Maryland & Delaware Railroad Company with access to Norfolk Southern Railway; Amtrak passenger service provided in Wilmington, Delaware approximately 60 miles from Chestertown

Truck: More than 100 local and long-distance trucking establishments are located on the Upper Eastern Shore
