

BUSINESS AND INDUSTRIAL PROPERTY⁶

Waldorf Station - a mixed-use project on a 145-acre site at the intersection of US 301 and MD 5, which will serve as the gateway to Charles County. The project is slated to include approximately 260,000 sf of retail, a Class A office building, a hotel, apartments, and townhomes.

Berry Point - construction has begun on over 551,000+ square feet of flex/research and development space, with an additional 37,850 square feet of supporting retail space. Once completed the project is expected to support over 2,100 jobs at full buildout and occupancy. The initial phase of the project will include 2 flex buildings, a gas station, and other retail uses.

St. Charles - one of the best master-planned communities in the country and only 11 miles from the Capital Beltway. Thousands of acres of industrial and commercial property are available in parcels from one to 100+ acres in three employment parks.

Morgantown - a 350-acre parcel of industrial land, Morgantown's access to highway, rail, and water makes this location arguably the most promising properties in the county's catalog.

TRANSPORTATION

Highways: U.S. 301, MD 5 and MD 210; Routes 5 and 210 connect to the National Capital Beltway (I-495) providing access to D.C. and Northern Virginia; Route 301 connects the region with Baltimore and Richmond, and serves as an alternate to I-95 through the D.C. area

Rail: CSX Transportation

Truck: Nearly 60 local and long-distance trucking establishments are located in Southern Maryland

Water: Served by the Port of Baltimore and the Potomac River

Air: The county business district lies 45 minutes from Washington's Reagan National Airport and about an hour from both Dulles International and BWI Marshall Airports; Maryland Airport near La Plata has upgraded to a 4200' runway and is the closest airport to D.C. for corporate jet traffic without the requirement of additional security agents

RECREATION AND CULTURE

Parks and Recreation: Charles County is home to 30 county-owned parks that total 3,626 acres. Each park offers amenities including fishing piers, picnic areas, scenic trails, and sport facilities. A popular destination in the county is The Indian Head Rail Trail, a 13-mile scenic hiker/biker trail on a converted railroad corridor. In addition to the county-operated parks, Charles County is home to three state parks and four wildlife areas that total nearly 10,000 acres. For water sport enthusiasts, the county hosts 300 miles of shoreline along the Potomac and Patuxent rivers.

Recreation facilities in the county offer seasonal programming for athletes and participants of all ages. Our most visited public facilities include Capital Clubhouse, White Plains Regional Golf Course, and Waldorf Senior and Recreational Center.

Entertainment: Regency Furniture Stadium, a 4,200 seat stadium located in Waldorf, is home to the Southern Maryland Blue Crabs professional baseball club. During the off season, the stadium hosts concerts, expos, and family-friendly events. For other sources of entertainment, visitors and residents are encouraged to visit our local businesses and restaurants for unique offerings including Southern Maryland Paintball, Bad Axe axe throwing, Copper Compass Distilling Co., and the Rad House.

Agritourism: Charles County's thriving agricultural scene consists of a variety of farm stands, markets, and pick-your-own experiences. Family-run farms including Shlagel Farms, Zekiah Farms 3, LLC and Hancock Family Farms offer proteins and produce along with other locally sourced products.

Seasonally, you can also find a variety of farm stands, craft vendors, and food vendors participating in the farmer's markets in La Plata and Waldorf

Cultural and Historical: From live shows to art exhibits, the county has something for everyone. Thanks to the work of many talented creatives, art displays and performances are prevalent in Charles County. The award-winning Port Tobacco Players are known for excellent stage productions, as well as their educational opportunities for up-and-coming performers. Mattawoman Creek Art Center and Shop 53 Custom Tattoo and Art Studio, LLC house phenomenal art pieces carefully crafted by skilled local artists.

Rich in history, the county is filled with cultural attractions depicting different walks of life and places in time. Visitors are encouraged to visit the Historic Port Tobacco Village, the Dr. Samuel Mudd House, and the Thomas Stone historic site to learn about notable figures and events that took place in the county's past.

Events: From family-friendly shows to niche-interest activities, events in Charles County offer unforgettable experiences for all attendees. Well-attended annual events include the Charles County Fair, Artsfest, Kris Kringle Christmas Market, Charles County Classic Carb Show, and the Charles County Holiday Tour.
